Hively hosted a free Family Read Night where families were able to enjoy a fun night of stories, and literacy activities. Introducing children to the joys of books, music and other fun activities, Hively's Family Read Night provided families the opportunity to engage together, while developing children's language skills.

Staff also provided a Parent Cafe. Parent Cafés are a nationally recognized peer-to-peer learning process to keep children safe and families strong. Parents/caregivers create safe spaces to explore their strengths and learn from themselves and each other how to use the

Strengthening Families Protective Factors with their loved ones. The Protective Factors include: Parent resilience, positive social connections, concrete support in times of need, knowledge of parenting and child development, and social and emotional competence

Parent Cafés are safe spaces where parents/caregivers talk about the challenges and victories of raising a family. Through peer-to-peer learning, participants explore their strengths, and create strategies from their own wisdom and experiences to help strengthen their families.

Beside the 25% of the youth that is on scholarship in our First Tee classes, our Outreach program to the Pleasanton community is entirely free of cost to all that choose to participate. Some of our outreach programs: PGA HOPE - (Help our Patriots Everywhere) Weekly free instruction to veterans. American Heart Association – Golf lessons for stroke "Victors" who have survived a stroke, we underwrite free golf for a year available to each new sign up.

GIRLS, Inc. - Summertime golf clinics for girls from underserved areas in Oakland, CA. R.A.D.D. - Recreation Department Athletes with Disabilities. Athletes with disabilities receive two-hour monthly golf clinics/lessons.

Special Olympics – Biweekly golf programming for Special Olympic Athletes.

Matters of Community – City of Fremont (CA) based youth receive once a month free golf lessons.

Report 1

Programs are thriving at the Sunflower Hill Gardens, with interested new groups reaching out consistently. This reporting period saw our Program Summer Session (June-mid August) hosting a total of 6 groups: 5 Adult Day Programs that continue to access the garden year-round, and 1 Summer School Transition class. The 5 Adult Day Programs counted above include the addition of a new program, Kaleidoscope from Dublin, who began participating in garden programs twice a month beginning in July. In the middle of August, we transitioned to our Fall School Year Session with hosting 16 different groups (5 Adult Day Programs, 9 Transition Classes, 2 HS Programs).

Describe any significant actions taken during the reporting period.

Report 1

This summer, we hosted 5 Interns with development disabilities; two of which were Pleasanton residents. We also hosted 1 Career Enhancement Intern, which is a volunteer position for a neuro-typical student interested in working with individuals with development disabilities as a career path.

In August, we hired a new Garden Teacher, Abby Lourenco, as our existing Garden Teacher, Rebecca Langstaff, transitioned to a new Programs Manager role. With the addition of Abby in the role of Garden Teacher, came new cooking and life skills focused lessons as she came to us with Food/Ameri-Corps experience, as well as with a horticulture background.

With the start of the Fall School Year Session, we welcomed back the Mocho program who has been to garden before, but this year specifically requested a visit structured similar to our interns. The Mocho team is a small workability group who began working on a repeat task week to week. As a result, our Garden/Teaching Assistant took on this team, leading their work on Snack Prep for the Thursday programs, which involved harvesting, washing, weighing, recording, and cutting produce as well as prepping snack platters for program participants.

In the garden, we are currently shifting our planting space to include more raised beds to increase accessibility for all participants. This will be particularly impactful for participants who use wheelchairs, walkers or are visually impaired.

Sunflower Hill also hosted our Fall Garden Festival on 10/26/2019, with over 90 participants who enjoyed a variety of fun activities in the garden at no cost. This event was made possible with volunteers from the Pleasanton NCL class of 2022. We had approximately 15 mothers/daughters join us for set up, event leading, and clean up.

Report 1

The summer internship was completed in August 2019. Everything went according to our plans, and the results were phenomenal! The interns completed energy benchmarking for all City-owned buildings and all PUSD-owned buildings. They compiled their findings into reports that were delivered to the City Council and PUSD Board of Trustees during regularly scheduled, televised meetings.

In total, the interns benchmarked the energy usage for 1,638,739 sq.ft. of building space, identified \$1,642,710 in potential taxpayer dollars saved on energy bills, and made recommendations that would lower Pleasanton's annual GHG emissions by 3,055 metric tons.

The interns benchmarked 39 facilities, worked a combined 3,573 hours, wrote 360 pages of reports, and gave 16 community presentations during the 9 weeks of the summer internship program.

Tri-Valley Haven (TVH) has created an effective, interactive and age appropriate curriculum specifically for Pleasanton Middle School students. We focus on healthy relationship education, consent and safe, personal boundaries. THV preventionists employ up-to-date resources from the "Expect Respect" Program, "In Touch with Teens" Curriculum, "Engaging Bystanders" (nsvrc.org), and "Bystander-Focused Prevention" (New York Department of Public Health).

Our training focuses on raising awareness and changing behavior. TVH Preventionists use technology and interactive activities which allow teens to be engaged and participate in scenarios which mirror real life events. These effective tools teach awareness, safe intervention strategies and build empathy at the same time.

TVH schedules classes when it is convenient for the students and when it will fit into the

school's curriculum. We collaborate with the science teachers and the administration at Pleasanton Middle School (PMS). Currently we have 2-day classes scheduled for Spring 2020 for every 7th Grader at PMS.

Pleasanton students take a post survey to make sure they have learned strategies to effectively and safely intervene in a situation where they are uncomfortable or their boundaries are being tested. The surveys give Pleasanton students an opportunity to provide feedback on the class itself. We get fabulous comments, and also ideas that we utilize to update our presentations.

Additionally, TVH sends material home with students so that they can continue these important discussions with their parents. We work with teachers so that the information taught by TVH is on the test. This ensures that students are getting a consistent message regarding personal boundaries, healthy relationships and anti-dating abuse many times over
