Capital Improvement Program - At a Glance

- Comprehensive financial plan for meeting capital improvements over the next four years
- Primarily "one-time" projects related to major city infrastructure including utilities, facilities and roadways
- No personnel expenses
- Dedicated funding sources



Capital Improvement Program - At a Glance

- First Two Years are Funded
- Final Two Years are for Planning Purposes
- Separated into Categories of Streets, Parks, Misc., Water, Sewer
- <u>62 Projects</u> Funded in First Two Years
- <u>63 Projects</u> Total
- Total Financial Resources all four years \$63.2 million
- Total Expenditures all four years \$<u>39.1 million</u>

- > City Council Priorities (Capital)
- > Department Head Workshops
- > City Analytical Tools (pavement management, utility mapping, field surveys)
- > Replacement Schedules

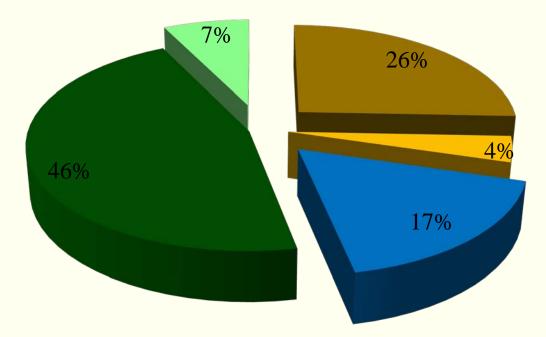

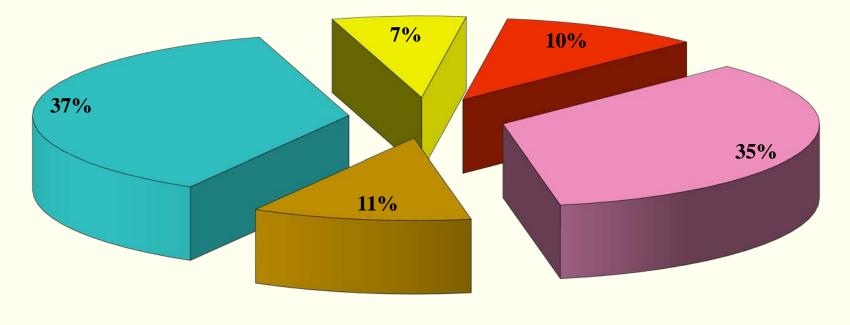

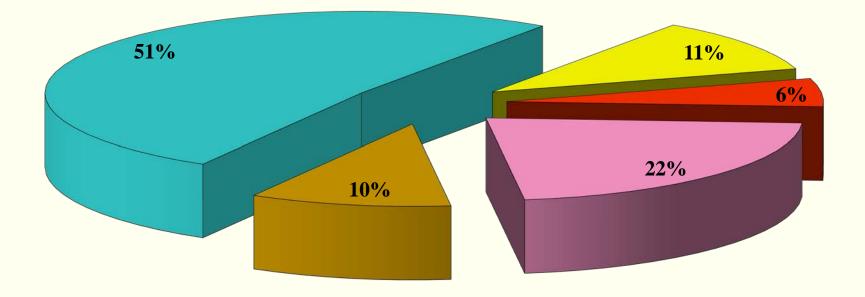

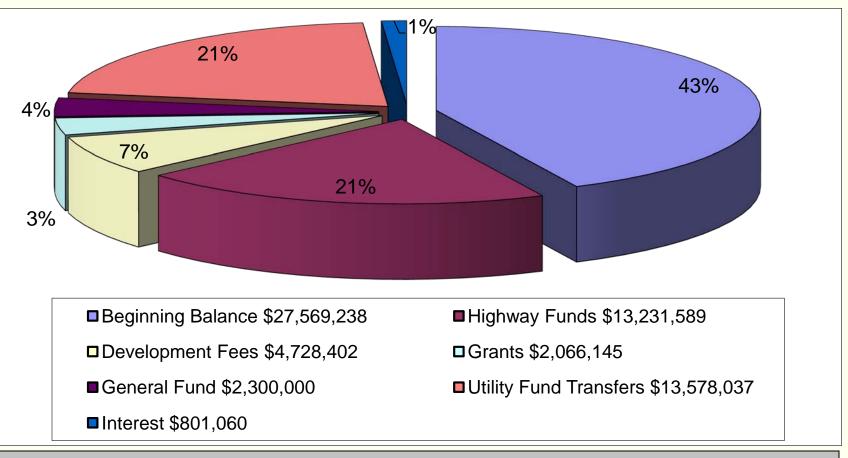

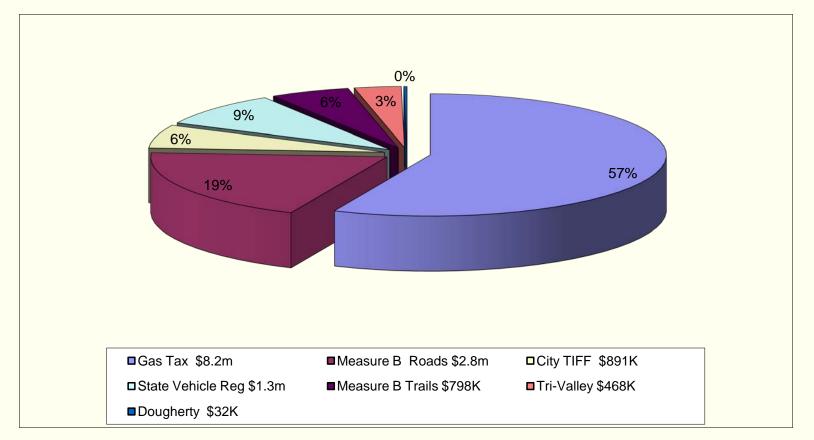
Capital Improvement Program Source of Major Financial Resources*

Summary of Streets Funding Sources*

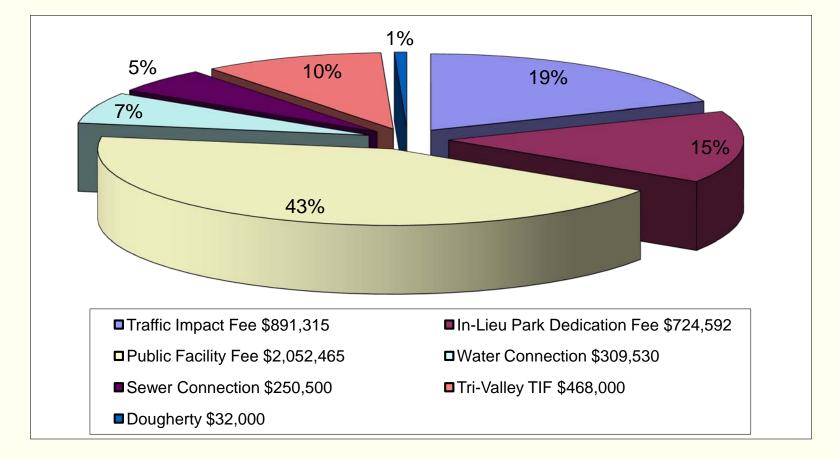

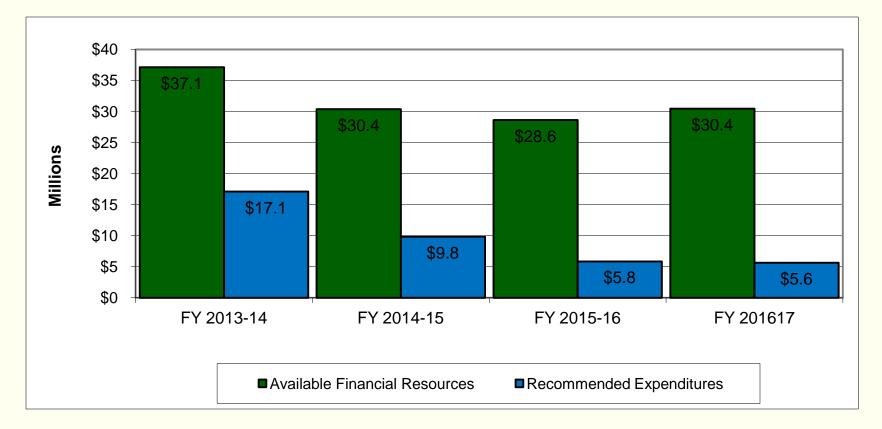


Capital Improvement Program Projected Development Revenue





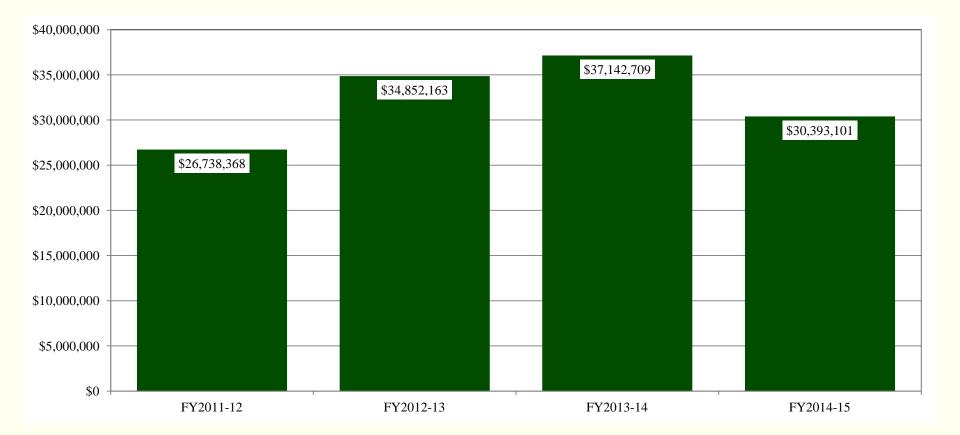
Comparison of CIP Financial Resources Versus Expenditures

Comparison of CIP Total Financial Resources (As included in adopted CIP's)



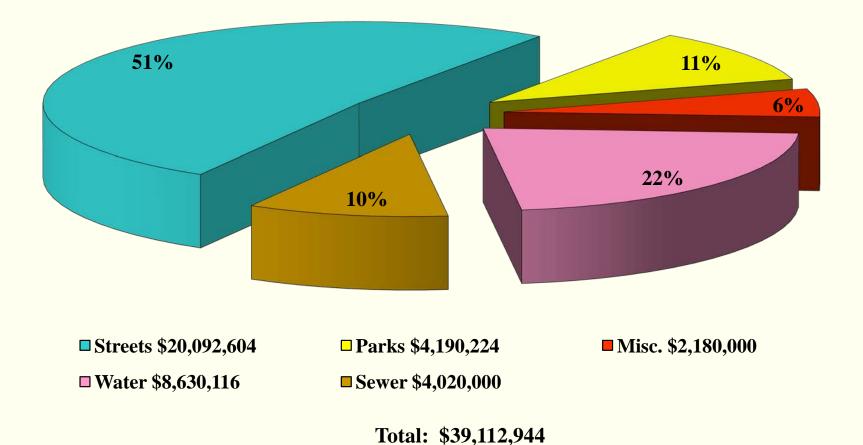

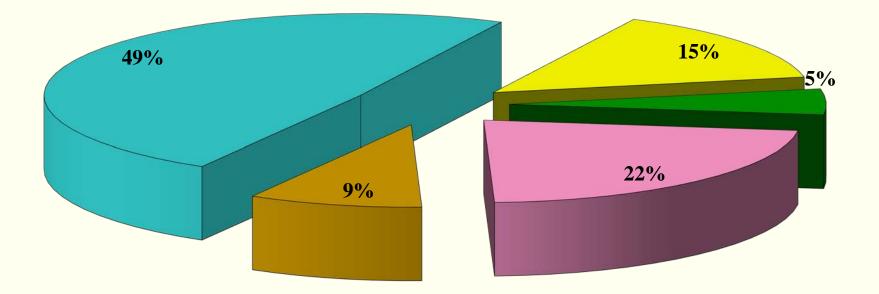
Capital Improvement Program Expenditures All Four Years

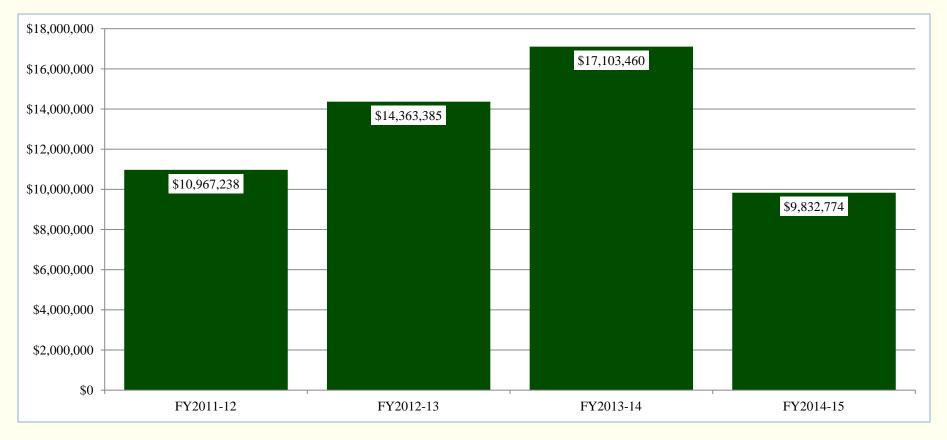

Library and Civic Center Master Plan	No additional funding; Current project balance is \$1.9 million	
Aquatic Center	Fully funded; under construction	
Old Stanley Road Resurfacing	No additional funding pending PG&E current project balance is \$2.1 million	
Pioneer Cemetery Improvements	Will utilize \$25,000 to \$50,000 from GF Contingency for master plan

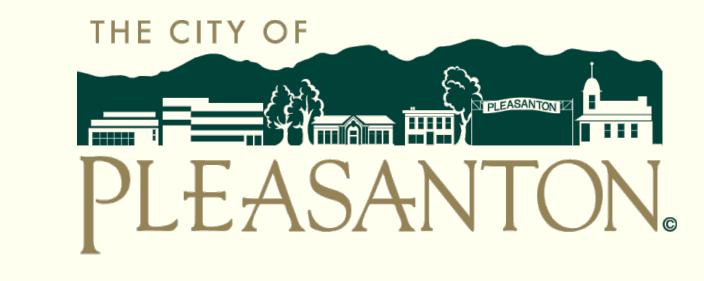
