AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT
BETWEEN THE
BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION
OF THE
PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM
AND THE
CITY COUNCIL
OF THE
CITY OF PLEASANTON

The Board of Administration, Public Employees' Retirement System, hereinafter referred to as Board, and the governing body of above public agency, hereinafter referred to as Public Agency, having entered into a contract effective September 1, 1953, and witnessed May 12, 1953, and as amended effective April 1, 1962, October 21, 1972, September 28, 1973, January 5, 1980, January 3, 1981 and April 11, 1981, which provides for participation of Public Agency in said System, Board and Public Agency hereby agree as follows:

- A. Paragraphs 1 through 10 are hereby stricken from said contract as executed effective April 11, 1981, and hereby replaced by the following paragraphs numbered 1 through 11 inclusive:
1. All words and terms used herein which are defined in the Public Employees' Retirement Law shall have the meaning as defined therein unless otherwise specifically provided. "Normal retirement age" shall mean age 60 for local miscellaneous members and age 50 for local safety members.
 2. Public Agency shall participate in the Public Employees' Retirement System from and after September 1, 1953 making its employees as hereinafter provided, members of said System subject to all provisions of the Public Employees' Retirement Law except such as apply only on election of a contracting agency and are not provided for herein and to all amendments to said Law hereafter enacted except those, which by express provisions thereof, apply only on the election of a contracting agency.
 3. Employees of Public Agency in the following classes shall become members of said Retirement System except such in each such class as are excluded by law or this agreement:
 - a. Local Fire Fighters (herein referred to as local safety members);
 - b. Local Police Officers (herein referred to as local safety members);

1. Local Police Officers shall include individuals defined by Section 20020 of the Government Code prior to its amendment at the 1973-74 Regular Legislative Session, effective January 1, 1973, employed by Public Agency prior to such amendment;
- c. Employees other than local safety members (herein referred to as local miscellaneous members).
4. In addition to the classes of employees excluded from membership by said Retirement Law, the following classes of employees shall not become members of said Retirement System:

NO ADDITIONAL EXCLUSIONS.

5. The fraction of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a local miscellaneous member shall be determined in accordance with Section 21251.13 of said Retirement Law (2% at age 60 Full).
6. The fraction of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a local safety member shall be determined in accordance with Section 21252.01 of said Retirement Law (2% at age 50 Full).
7. The following additional provisions of the Public Employees' Retirement Law, which apply only upon election of a contracting agency, shall apply to the Public Agency and its employees:
 - a. Sections 21380 - 21387 (1959 Survivor Program) excluding Section 21382.2 (Increased 1959 Survivor Benefits) and Section 21382.4 (Third Level of 1959 Survivor Benefits).
 - b. Section 20020 ("Local Police Officer" shall include persons assigned to identification and communication duties in the Police Department who were not classified as local safety members and who were in such employment on or prior to August 4, 1972, and who elected to be local safety members).
 - c. Section 20862.8 (Unused Sick Leave Credit), for local miscellaneous members only.
 - d. Section 20024.2 (One-Year Final Compensation), for local fire members only.
 - e. Section 20500 (Cost Sharing) Public Agency and its employees have agreed to share the cost of the following benefit applicable to Section 20024.2 (One-Year Final Compensation).

From and after the effective date of this amendment to contract the local fire fighter employees of Public Agency shall be assessed an additional 1.750% of their compensation - for a total contribution rate of 10.750% pursuant to Government Code Section 20500.

8. Public Agency, in accordance with Government Code Section 20740, ceased to be an "employer" for purposes of Section 20759 effective on April 11, 1981. Accumulated contributions of Public Agency shall be fixed and determined as provided in Government Code Section 20759, and accumulated contributions thereafter shall be held by the Board as provided in Government Code Section 20759.
9. Public Agency shall contribute to said Retirement System as follows:
 - a. With respect to local miscellaneous members, the agency shall contribute the following percentages of salaries earned as members of said Retirement System:
 - (1) 7.492 percent until June 30, 2000 on account of the liability for current service benefits. (Subject to annual change.)
 - b. With respect to local safety members, the agency shall contribute the following percentages of salaries earned as members of said Retirement System:
 - (1) 0.039 percent until June 30, 2000 on account of the liability for prior service benefits. (Subject to annual change.)
 - (2) 19.061 percent until June 30, 2000 on account of the liability for current service benefits. (Subject to annual change.)
 - c. A reasonable amount, as fixed by the Board, payable in one installment within 60 days of date of contract to cover the costs of administering said System as it affects the employees of Public Agency, not including the costs of special valuations or of the periodic investigation and valuations required by law.
 - d. A reasonable amount, as fixed by the Board, payable in one installment as the occasions arise, to cover the costs of special valuations on account of employees of Public Agency, and costs of the periodic investigation and valuations required by law.

10. Contributions required of Public Agency and its employees shall be subject to adjustment by Board on account of amendments to the Public Employees' Retirement Law, and on account of the experience under the Retirement System as determined by the periodic investigation and valuation required by said Retirement Law.
11. Contributions required of Public Agency and its employees shall be paid by Public Agency to the Retirement System within thirty days after the end of the period to which said contributions refer or as may be prescribed by Board regulation. If more or less than the correct amount of contributions is paid for any period, proper adjustment shall be made in connection with subsequent remittances. Adjustments on account of errors in contributions required of any employee may be made by direct payments between the employee and the Board.

E. This amendment shall be effective on the 20th day of September, 1986.
