TITLE:Review and Discussion of Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP)
and Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF)

BACKGROUND:

The 2013-2014 Budget Act replaced the previous K-12 finance system with a new Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF). For school districts and charter schools, the LCFF creates base, supplemental, and concentration grants in place of the previous K-12 funding streams, including revenue limits and categorical programs.

As part of the LCFF, school districts are required to develop, adopt, and annually update a three-year Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) beginning July 1, 2014, using a template adopted by the California State Board of Education.

The Pleasanton Unified School District's newly formed Local Control Accountability Committee comprised of parents/community members, student and staff function in an advisory role to the Superintendent and the Governing Board in developing the Local Control Accountability Plan.



LCFF Target Entitlement – ADA Based Totals





FY13/14 - FY20/21


Local Control Accountability Plan
