A RESOLUTION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PLEASANTON APPROVING A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT APPLICATION AT 6691 OWENS DRIVE FOR SHENGMENG EDUCATION CENTER P18-0051

- WHEREAS, on March 8, 2018, Shengmeng Education Center, applied for Conditional Use Permit approval to operate a tutoring facility for more than 20 students at any one time located at 6691 Owens Drive; and
- **WHEREAS**, zoning for the property is PUD-I/C-O (Planned Unit Development Industrial/Commercial-Office) District; and
- WHEREAS, the project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15301, (Existing Facilities), since the project would not result in the expansion of the exterior or the building and/or would be limited to interior alternations of the existing building. Therefore, no additional environmental review is required; and
- **WHEREAS**, on July 11, 2018, the Planning Commission, based on comments received immediately before the scheduled public hearing requested a continuation of the item to a date uncertain; and
- **WHEREAS,** on September 21, 2018, the applicant submitted a revised Conditional Use Permit application, including operation of a tutoring facility with up to 80 students at certain times; and
- **WHEREAS,** on October 24, 2018, the Planning Commission held a duly-noticed public hearing, considered relevant exhibits, recommendations of the City staff concerning this application, and received testimony from the applicant and interested parties.
- **NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Planning Commission of the City of Pleasanton, based on the entire record of proceedings, including the oral and written staff reports and all public comment and testimony:

# Section 1: Findings for Conditional Use Permit Approval

With respect to the approval of P18-0051, the Planning Commission makes the following findings as required by Section 18.124.070 of the Pleasanton Municipal Code:

A. That the proposed location of the conditional use is in accordance with the objectives of the zoning ordinance and the purpose of the district in which the site is located.

Some of the objectives of the zoning ordinance are to: foster a harmonious, convenient, workable relationship among land uses, protect existing land uses from inharmonious influences and harmful intrusions, and ensure that public and private lands ultimately are used for the purposes which are most appropriate and beneficial to the City as a

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whole. As conditioned, the Planning Commission finds the proposed tutoring facility would be consistent with these objectives and would create more educational facilities within the City. The tutoring facility would be operated so as to not impact or interfere with the surrounding uses in that the number of students, hours of operation, drop-off/pick-up procedures, and staffing levels would not generate substantial noise, parking demand, or traffic.

The subject site is zoned PUD-I/C-O) (Planned Unit Development – Industrial/Commercial-Office) District, which generally has the characteristics of the City's I-P (Industrial Park) District. One purpose of the I-P District is to provide locations for uses that can operate in close proximity to commercial and residential uses with minimum mutual adverse impacts. As conditioned, the Planning Commission finds the proposed tutoring facility would be consistent with the Zoning Ordinance objectives and zoning district purposes in that it would be operated so as to not impact or interfere with the adjacent/nearby uses. The proposed tutoring facility would be operated entirely indoors on a property with an adequate circulation system and parking supply to support the proposed use. The applicant would also be required to mitigate any future nuisances that may occur as a result of the proposed use.

B. That the proposed location of the conditional use and the conditions under which it would be operated or maintained will not be detrimental to the public health, safety, or welfare, or materially injurious to the properties or improvements in the vicinity.

As conditioned, the Planning Commission finds the proposed tutoring facility would make a good neighbor, since all of its proposed activities would occur indoors, would generally be scheduled outside of the operating hours of nearby commercial uses, and would not involve large numbers of attendees. Tutoring facilities generally do not subject surrounding uses to heavy truck traffic, hazardous odors, high noise levels, or other objectionable influences. If the recommended conditions of approval are followed, the Planning Commission finds the proposed tutoring facility would not be detrimental to the adjacent/nearby uses. All streets around the subject site are designed per City standards to provide safe ingress and egress into and out of the site. In addition, there is adequate parking available to meet the project's demand. Conditions have also been included that would require the applicant to mitigate any future nuisances as a result of the proposed use.

C. That the proposed conditional use will comply with each of the applicable provisions of the zoning ordinance.

The site's zoning conditionally permits tutoring facilities with more than 20 students at any one time. Granting a CUP for the proposed use would be consistent with the City's ability to regulate zoning as listed in Chapter 18.124 of the Municipal Code. In addition, the Planning Commission finds that, as conditioned, the proposed use will comply with all provisions and requirements of the City's zoning ordinance and the approved PUD for Pleasanton Business Park.

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Section 2: The Planning Commission hereby approves C Education Center for Conditional Use Permit a 6691 Owens Drive subject to the Conditions of hereto and made part of this case by reference	pproval to operate a tutoring facility located at f Approval shown in Attachment 1, attached

# EXHIBIT A DRAFT CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

# P18-0051 6691 Owens Drive October 24, 2018

The applicant is hereby notified, as part of this approval, that (s)he is required to satisfy and maintain compliance with the conditions of approval below. Where approval by the Director of Community Development, Planning Division, Director of Engineering/City Engineer, City Attorney, Chief Building and Safety Official, Fire Department or other City staff is required, review shall be for compliance with all applicable conditions of approval, adopted policies and guidelines, ordinances, laws and regulations, and accepted practices related to the approval. In addition to complying with the conditions below, the applicant is required to comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws that pertain to this project whether or not specifically noted herein.

This approval is granted for Conditional Use Permit approval to operate a tutoring facility located on Assessor Parcel No. 941- 2817-006-00 at 6691 Owens Drive. Development shall be substantially as shown on the project materials listed below:

a. Project plans, Exhibit B, prepared by Shengmeng Education Center, dated "Received" on September 21, 2018 and "Received" October 10, 2018 and Attachment A.1, prepared by City of Pleasanton staff, titled "Staff-clarified narrative," and kept on file in the Planning Division of the Community Development Department.

The project materials listed above are collectively the "Approved Plans."

# THIS APPROVAL IS GRANTED SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

- 1. APPROVAL AND REVISIONS: The proposed use shall be in substantial conformance with the "Approved Plans" and "Staff-clarified narrative," except as modified by the following conditions. Minor changes to the plans may be allowed subject to the approval of the Director of Community Development if found to be in substantial conformance with the approved exhibits. **Project specific condition.**
- 2. EXPIRATION CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT: This Conditional Use Permit (CUP) approval will lapse and shall become void one year following the date on which the CUP became effective, unless prior to the expiration of one year a building permit is issued and construction is commenced and diligently pursued toward completion on the site which was the subject of the CUP application; or a certificate of occupancy is issued for the structure which was the subject of the CUP application; or the site is occupied if no building permit or certificate of occupancy is required; or the applicant or his/her successor has filed a request for extension with the Zoning Administrator pursuant to the provisions of the Pleasanton Municipal Code.

- 3. APPEAL PERIOD: The building permit submittal will only be accepted after completion of the appeal period provided in the Municipal Code unless the applicant submits a signed statement acknowledging the plan check fees may be forfeited in the event the approval is overturned on appeal, or the design is significantly changed as a result of the appeal. In no case will a building permit be issued prior to the expiration of the appeal period.
- 4. LIABILITY AND INDEMNIFICATION: To the extent permitted by law, the project applicant shall hold harmless, defend (with counsel acceptable to the City), and indemnify the City, its City Council, its officers, commissions, employee and agents from and against any claim, action, or proceeding brought by a third party against the indemnified parties and/or the applicant to attack, set aside, or void the approval of the project or any permit authorized hereby for the project, including without limitation, reimbursing the City its attorneys' fees and costs incurred in defense of the litigation. The City may, in its sole discretion, elect to defend any such action with attorneys of its choice.
- 5. PICK-UP/DROP-OFF PROCEDURES: Parents and guardians shall park in parking stalls when dropping off or picking up students. No double parking, parking in drive aisles, or curbside drop-off or pick-up shall be permitted. **Project specific condition.**

# **Conditional Use Permits**

- 6. NOISE: The applicant shall:
  - a. Keep all exterior doors of the building closed when not being used for ingress/egress purposes.
  - b. Inform all students, parents/guardians, and guests to not loiter outside of the building and to be courteous and quiet when entering or leaving the parking area. **Project specific condition.**
- 7. MAINTENANCE: The applicant shall maintain the subject property or if applicable, the area surrounding the tenant space, in a clean and orderly manner at all times.
- 8. MODIFICATIONS/OPERATION CHANGES: If additional hours of operation, activities, and/or an increase in the number of students/staff, beyond what is stated on/in the "Approved Plans" and Attachment A.1, are desired, City review and approval is required prior to making said changes/modifications. The applicant shall submit any proposed changes/modifications in writing. The Director of Community Development may approve the modification or refer the matter to the Planning Commission if judged to be substantial. **Project specific condition.**
- 9. CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT REVIEW: If the operation of this use results in conflicts pertaining to parking, noise, traffic/circulation, or other factors, at the discretion of the Director of Community Development, this conditional use permit may be submitted to the Planning Commission for their subsequent review at a public hearing. If necessary, the Planning Commission may modify or add conditions of approval to mitigate such impacts, or may revoke said conditional use permit.

- 10. SIGNAGE: This approval does not include approval of any signage for Shengmeng Education Center. If signs are desired, Shengmeng Education Center shall submit a sign proposal to the Planning Division for review and approval prior to sign installation.
- 11. EXTERIOR CHANGES: Changes to the exterior of the building shall not be made without prior approval from the Planning Division.
- 12. RELOCATION: If the applicant wishes to relocate the use to a new address or tenant suite, the applicant shall secure a new conditional use permit prior to occupying the new building or tenant space.
- 13. IMPACT FEES: The applicant shall pay the required sewer fees, traffic impact fees, and all other fees the proposed use may be subject to prior to occupancy. The type and amount of the fees shall be those in effect at the time of occupancy.
- 14. BUILDING PERMIT: Any tenant improvement plans shall be submitted to the Building and Safety Division for review and approval prior to operation. The applicant shall obtain a building permit prior to commencement of any work.
- 15. BUILDING AND FIRE CLEARANCE: Prior to issuance of a business license, the applicant shall contact the Building and Safety Division and the Fire Department to ensure the proposed use of the tenant space meets Building and Fire Code requirements. If required, the applicant shall obtain all appropriate City permits.

# ATTACHMENT A.1 STAFF-CLARIFIED NARRATIVE

# P18-0051, Conditional Use Permit 6691 Owens Drive. Shengmeng Education Center

# **Description of Proposal**

- 1) Details of SME business hours, class sessions and corresponding times are in 8 and 9 (attached).
- 2) The Chinese classes on Sunday afternoon will not exceed 80 students on-site at any one time.
- 3) The school-break program is limited to a maximum of 30 students on-site at any one time.
- 4) Six passenger vans will be utilized by SME staff (paid or volunteer) to pick up students in the after-school program when parents/guardians cannot transport their child(ren) to the site and when more than 20 students will be on-site at any one time. These vans will be parked at the facility overnight.
- 5) Student enrollment includes grades K to 12.
- 6) Students may be provided with dry snacks and/or foods from licensed restaurants such as In N Out and Chick Fil-A.
- 7) Parents are to be informed to drop off their students and park their cars in designated parking stalls to the south side of the building through our website, social media groups, emails, and classroom.

# **Proposed Use**

ShengMeng Education Center (SME) leases the property at 6691 Owens Dr., Pleasanton, CA 94588 with about 8,429 square feet as a learning center. SME is an educational center that aims to help students develop a competitive edge in today's environment. Our programs cater to each student's needs, such as: homework assistances, skill developments, and test preparations.

# Expected number of people in the SME facility

Staff and teachers: Up to 40 people (on payroll or volunteer)

On-site staff and teachers: Up to 10 people at a time (note 3 staff are also teachers)

Potential patrons: Average 3 patrons/visitors at a time

# **Hours of operations**

Limited to the hours shown in Tables 8 and 9.

Administrative Staff Office Hours: Monday through Sunday: 9:00 AM – 9:00 PM

### Site and Building Modification

SME hasn't remodeled the building.

### **Impact on parking**

The entire building, 17029 square feet, hosts two tenants: SME at 6691 Owens Drive and Sunflower Academy (SFA) at 6693 Owens Drive. The whole property provides 63 parking stalls. Exhibit B shows the site plan of 6691. SME uses about 8,429 square feet, which allows SME use at least 31 parking stalls. There are no clear lines dividing hundreds of shared parking spaces at Pleasanton Park Business Center. To our knowledge, there are no shared parking agreement in this business center. Most businesses here close by 5:00pm (Table 2). This will potentially leave many vacant parking spaces for overflow parking during the evenings and weekends.

The current tenant of SFA at 6693 Owens Drive occupies another half of the same building. SFA primarily provides after school service for elementary school kids. SFA generally utilizes less than their share of parking space, as the kids are primarily dropped off by SFA pick-up vans. Most parents of SFA pick up their kids between 6:00PM to 6:30PM. The current enrollment of the SME after school program is less than 20 students. When the enrollment is over a certain number, e.g., 20 students, SME will use passenger vans to pick up students and park the van at the facility overnight.

Here, we provide two class schedules: one during regular school days, another during school breaks (Exhibits 8 and 9). They list both current and future class attendances on average.

Tables 3-6 shows the numbers of students, teachers and staff onsite and accumulative occupied parking stalls. We assume that half of the parents will stop, drop off students and then leave without parking their vehicles. The other half of parents will park their vehicles for a few minutes either to walk their students to the classroom or meet their students at the classroom during the pick-up.

Table 3 shows the number of on-site teachers and staff, the number of on-site students and cumulative occupied parking stalls Monday to Friday during the regular school days (Fall and Spring semesters). From 3:30pm to 6:05pm, we offer the after-school classes (see Table 8, SME Class Schedule). The maximum number of teachers and staff on-site is 6. The students in attendance are up to 50 at any given time during the after-school weekday programs. With 6 pick-up vans, maximum 17 parking stalls are needed before 6pm. These numbers are well below the capacity of our facility.

Our Saturday Schedule is dominated by our German classes in the morning (Table 4). The highest occupancy is 6 teachers and staff, 45 students. During drop-off and pickup, 35 parking stalls may be needed for 5-10 minutes. There are plenty of vacant parking stalls available for overflow parking in the Saturday morning.

The primary program on Sunday is Chinese classes in the afternoon (Table 5). We may have maximum 10 teachers and staff onsite. The highest attendance may reach 80 students. We may occupy up to 56 parking stalls for a short period of 5-10 minutes during the drop off and pick-up. There are plenty of vacant parking stalls available for overflow parking in the Sunday afternoon. Our pickup vans will be parked at the facility overnight.

Table 6 shows the number of teachers and staff and students on-site, and parking needs from Monday to Friday during school breaks, for example, spring, summer and winter breaks. The maximum on-site student attendance is 30. The maximum on-site staff and teachers are 5.

For most days, SME needs less than 16 parking stalls over 90% of time. Our peak parking needs are during drop-off and pick-up for about 10-20 minutes between classes.

The spacious "Open Library" serves as a waiting place for patrons, and a break room for students and teachers. We provide 7 tables and 14 chairs.

Our facility has enough tables and chairs to accommodate 120 students and 9 teachers in 9 classrooms.

The access doors between two building tenants are locked and alarm-monitored by ADT to prevent cross-access through SME's designated private bathrooms. The main entrance will be the north door. SME encourages staff and patrons to enter the facility through the west door, because most of our designated parking stalls are in the back of the facility. The south door will be mainly for loading and unloading purpose. See Exhibit C - Floor Plan.

# **Choir and Dance Classes**

We don't plan to offer any choir or dance classes.

# **Building and Safety**

SME hasn't modified the building, and currently has no plan to do so.

# Fire Safety

The maximum capacity of each room is listed in Table 5. We clearly mark the exit route from each room on Exhibit D. About 80 overhead sprinklers are available.

### Traffic

SME minimizes the traffic impact with the following measures and efforts:

- 1) No classes during morning rush hours (7:00-9:00am)
- 2) No drop-off/pick-up during the during the afternoon rush hours (4:00-6:00pm)
- 3) Most parents spend less than 5 minutes on-site for picking up or dropping off their students. Some parents may park their vehicle for 5 to 10 minutes to escort their young children to the classroom or pick up their children in the facility.
- 4) There could be some occasions when parents have scheduling conflicts. SME will assist in arranging and coordinating for rides for children in the form of carpooling.
- 5) SME uses computers for students' check-in and check-out to speed up the process
- 6) Use vans to pick up students for the after-school program

Most businesses at Pleasanton Park Business Center close by 5:00pm (Table 2). This ensures little or no traffic congestion at this business center in the evenings and during weekends.

In conclusion, SME will have little or no impact on the on-site traffic during rush hours, which is supported by the enclosed SME class schedules (Exhibits 8 and 9).

# **Agreement for Shared Parking**

The Southwind Properties, LLC, the owner of the building, does not have any written agreement on the shared parking. It is well understood that the parking spaces in Pleasanton Park Business Center are shared by all businesses and their patrons.

I'm the Owner from Sunflower Academy (6693 Owens Dr). Last Monday (July 2nd), I received a notice from the city about a hearing for the expansion of the Shengmeng Education Center (July 11th). I strongly disagree with this because the Shengmeng Education Center lacks integrity and is dishonest.

First, when they rented the building, they promised the landlord that the Shengmeng Education Center would only start junior high and high school tutoring courses. I also confirmed with the landlord that the courses they offered would be different from ours and we wouldn't have any conflicts and traffic problems. However, they have now violated their side of the agreement back then by opening classes for 5-12 year old students (primary school age).

In addition, they also opened a "Full Day Camp" during the summer, which resulted in insufficient parking space. Currently, their license only allows them to accommodate up to 20 students at a time. However, instead of following this rule, they opened three overlapping courses that significantly bypassed the limitations and ages of the 20 students and the application. You can see many different things on the Shengmeng's website

(<a href="https://shengmengedu.com/summercamp2018">https://shengmengedu.com/summercamp2018</a>/), including class time and student age and numbers. These points reflect the lacks integrity and dishonest of the Shengmeng Education Center.

For example:

Lego: 7/9 - 7/13: 9:00am-12:00pm (Age 6-8), 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm (Age 9-13)

Writing: 7/9 - 7/13: 2:00 pm - 5:00 pm Etiquette: 7/9 - 7/13: 4:30 pm - 6:30 pm

Since there have much more than 20 students at the same time, even some parents, without parking the car in the parking space, directly open the door to let the students down, which affects the car behind and is not safe for students.

If so, then more people and cars will enter the parking lot. The parking lot will be more crowded, chaotic, unsafe and have a higher risk factor. # 1) Lacks integrity and dishonest:

I am the owner of Sun Flower Academy. Our school has already operated 8 years in Pleasanton. During these 8 years, we provide additional services for the community and relieve the worries of parents. We volunteer provided the show for district elementary schools such as Walnut Grove, Donlon, Mohr and Fairlands. Every year, we have around 100 students won the competition held by Chinese American Abacus associate.

From beginning, we are happy to see that Shengmeng Education Center (SME) provide the tutoring service for junior high as we are told by SME and landlord several times before. We think this is complimentary to our sunflower existing services because our students are from elementary schools. The student could find appropriate services from SME when they enter the middle schools and after.

The SME current practice breaks what they claimed in both the age of target kids and service types they will provide. They are not only asking adding after school service for the students 4<sup>th</sup> grade and up, but also extend the target student to the Kindergarten. This totally conflict with Sunflower existing service and age of student.

# 2) Repeated behavior broke city regulation and their own promise:

I want to express my concerns on the issue of SME's repeated violations of their current issued license limits 20 students, and we even doubt whether they'll follow the 60 limit they are applying given they have six currents classes today.
