SUBJECT: Actions of the City Council, September 7, 2010

Actions of the Zoning Administrator and Planning Commission

Council accepted the report.

<u>Second reading of Ordinance No. 2005, Pleasanton Gateway L.L.C. (Scott Trobbe)</u>, for a seven-year extension of the Development Agreement (PDAM-03) between the City and Pleasanton Gateway regarding its eight-building office development totaling 745,000 square feet on an approximately 39.22-acre site at 6750 Bernal Avenue.

Council adopted the ordinance.

<u>Second reading of Ordinance No. 2006</u>, rescinding Ordinance No. 1989 (that prezoned and rezoned the Staples Ranch site) and adopting an ordinance pre-zoning and rezoning the same site.

Council adopted the ordinance.

<u>PUD-57, PUD-68, and PUD-80, Staples Ranch</u>, Establishing Planned Unit Development Plans including Allowed Uses for Hendrick Automotive Group, Continuing Life Communities, and a Neighborhood Park/Storm Water Detention Basin at Staples Ranch, and Consideration of Agreements for the Staples Ranch Project, including a Development Agreement.

Council approved all the Staples Ranch items per staff recommendation, with the following modifications and general conditions/directions:

- Requested future discussion between staff and the applicants regarding the Climate Action Plan and possibly incorporating items from this Plan into all the projects;
- Requested future discussion between staff and the applicants regarding Bay Friendly landscaping and possibly incorporating guidance from the Bay Friendly Landscaping Guidelines into the CLC and Hendrick projects;
- Requested to review the final green building checklists for all the projects;
- Required moisture sensors in landscaping areas for all the projects;
- Required staff discussion with Hendrick regarding efforts to secure PV grant funding for the Hendrick project;
- Required all motorcycle-related uses for the Hendrick project to be reviewed by the Council; and
- Required recycled materials in furniture at the Neighborhood Park.
