

# HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION AGENDA REPORT

TITLE: SELECT COMMISSION REPRESENTATIVES FOR VARIOUS SUBCOMMITTEES

# **SUMMARY**

Prior to the pandemic, the Human Services Commission selected subcommittee representatives annually. Many of these subcommittees were put on hold during the pandemic. As restrictions ease, it is important to select representatives from the commission to reengage with these organizational meetings.

# **RECOMMENDATION**

Select commission representatives for the Pleasanton Rides Task Force, Tri-Valley Nonprofit Alliance, and CityServe of the Tri-Valley.

### **BACKGROUND**

Historically, the Human Services Commission had representatives on various subcommittees and time was allocated on the regular monthly agenda for commission representatives to report on progress made and items discussed at the various subcommittee meetings.

During the pandemic, the subcommittee reports section of the regular agenda was removed as commissions were tasked to discuss items that required City Council action. During the pandemic, most of the subcommittees did not meet.

#### DISCUSSION

As we move out of the pandemic restrictions, subcommittees are starting up again and it is important that the Human Services Commission have representatives on each of the following:

- Pleasanton Rides Task Force These meetings are hosted at the Pleasanton Senior Center and take place quarterly, typically on a Monday afternoon.
  Meetings involve service updates and include representatives from Livermore Amador Valley Transit Authority, Senior Support Program of the Tri-Valley and Community Resources for Independent Living.
- Tri-Valley Nonprofit Alliance These meetings are hosted monthly on the second Thursday at 10:30am. Meetings provide regular opportunities to meet and collaborate with peers to enhance and grow the skills and talents of the dedicated people who work and volunteer in the nonprofit sector.
- CityServe of the Tri-Valley These meetings are hosted quarterly; typically midday and the location rotates between the three Tri-Valley Cities. The meetings consist of regional human service updates and are intended for resource and referral purposes.

Commissioners are asked to appoint a primary person to attend as well as an alternate for each subcommittee listed above.
